NARR's Mission:

- Our mission is to support persons in recovery from addiction by improving their access to quality recovery residences in Indiana through standards, support services, placement, education, research and advocacy.
- NARR advocates for Fair Housing Rights

INARR



- Managed by Mental Health America of Indiana (MHA)

Features of INARR:

- Strong influence of peers
- Provides training and technical assistance to certified houses
- DMHA-supported and financed. Only INARR-approved houses can bill Recovery Works
- Annual conference provides training and networking opportunities
- Renewal required every two years- DMHA often subsidizes associated fees

Landlord Mitigation Reserve



- Joint project with IHCD (Indiana Housing & Community Development Authority)

- LMR was created with the idea that people can and do change. Often times, past issues can haunt a person long after recovery, and being unable to find eligible housing is a common problem.
- IHCD is working with state landlords to participate in the LMR program
- DMHA is in charge of vetting potential LMR candidates and issuing certification if approved
- If approved, DMHA will 'guarantee' rent to the landlord under certain conditions
