## Public Health Alert: Overdose Activity

Dear Colleagues,

Daily Hamilton County overdose surveillance for May 18 has indicated a spike in activity. The daily overdose report demonstrates an increase in Hamilton County emergency departments (ED) visits due to overdose; the ED visit count surpassed statistical thresholds for expected counts when fifteen overdoses were observed during the period of 6 am May 18 to 6 am May 19. Corroborating this spike is a general increasing trend in 911 dispatch and ED counts over the previous week.

Local public health partners and the Hamilton County Heroin Coalition are issuing this alert to increase community awareness and advise first responders, healthcare providers, and substance users and their families of the increased risk for overdose in our community. This alert should serve as a notice to consider adjusting response capacity and implementing necessary protective measures which should include:

- Do not field test drugs or injection equipment.
