Fresh Start Begins in 2015

- High intensity residential substance use disorder treatment (ASAM 3.5 LOC)
- Our focus is women who are pregnant and mothers
- Moms can have up to two children with her ages 5 and under





Services

 - Nurse Practitioner / MD Evaluations
 - Medication Assisted Treatment
- Group and Individual Counseling
- Life skills and Parenting groups
- Case Management
- Aftercare for women who are pregnant and mothers with newborns







Fresh Start Recovery Center | Theodora House



- 40 beds
- Opened 2015
- 927 N. Pennsylvania Ave Indianapolis, Indiana



Fresh Start Recovery Center – Winchester House



- 18 beds
- Opened June 2018
- Rural Indiana



Fresh Start Recovery Center – Evansville House



- 16 beds
- Opened August 2019
- Southwest Indiana

Fresh Start Recovery Center | Columbus House



- 14 beds
- Opened October 2020
- Southeast Indiana





Pregnant & Parenting Program Outcomes

- Our focus is any woman who is pregnant in Indiana with substance use disorder
- Started January 2018
- Ball State College of Health is evaluating
- Residential Phase—Fresh Start Recovery Center
- Aftercare Phase—Family Coach
- Referred by:
 - Health care (43%)
 - Self (36%)



Pregnant & Parenting Program Outcomes

Opiate use pilot grant for pregnant women

- 94 women who were pregnant
- 50 births
- 78% no NICU stay for Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome (NAS)
- 74% of newborns had no unprescribed medications in their system
- 73% completed the residential phase






Pregnant & Parenting Pilot Outcomes

- 67% of moms breast fed
- 96% immunizations
- 9 open DCS cases
- 78% of moms on Medication Assisted Treatment

Fresh Start Recovery Centers - Who to Refer

Women with SUD – particularly opioids

- At least 18 years old
- Pregnant or parenting
- With or without children
- With or without DCS involvement
- Releases/Violators
- Assess at 3.5 ASAM level of care



Family Preservation Services

Keeping families together through family-focused supportive services at home with a Family Coach.

- Focus on mothers of Fresh Start Recovery Centers during and after residential treatment
- Marion County & within 1hr radius
- Parenting & life skills development
- Individual, group, & family therapy





Outpatient Treatment Center

Experienced clinicians providing individualized treatments plans through innovative, results-driven substance use and mental health treatment.

- Assessment, case management, intensive outpatient services each week
- Counseling for individuals, groups, couples, & families
- Social, coping, employment skills
- Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT)





Turning Point Recover Center – Men's Program

- Located in Indianapolis
- Focus on reentry/criminal justice populations
 - ASAM 3.5
 - Matrix Model
- Capacity 15
- Priority population TRV
